Uttlesford Updates



Members of the Community Safety Partnership have been in the areas of Elsenham, Berden, Farnham and Manuden as part of our reaching rural communities project. PCSO O'Donnell Smith along with our partners from Uttlesford District Council visited and offered support to local farmers.

This project will continue into the spring.



Officers from our Roads Policing Team carried out a speed check in the Quendon area of Uttlesford.

Disappointingly the highest speed recorded in the 30mph zone was 49mph.

Those drivers found exceeding the speed limit were reported for excess







PC Sampson and PCSO Morris attended the library in Thaxted to offer crime prevention advice and reassurance to local residents following some antisocial behaviour reported in the area.









Officers from our Community Policing Team attended reports of hare coursing in the Audley End area of Uttlesford.

Working alongside Cambridgeshire Constabulary three suspects were detained.

A 25 year old male from Surrey was located in Essex and has been reported for relevant offences.

Community funded PCSO, Alex Stewart attended the parish of Elsenham alongside our colleagues at Essex Fire and Rescue to speak to residents, offering crime prevention and fire safety advice.

A speed check was carried out in the area, Several drivers were given words of advice for exceeding the 30mph speed limit, and two drivers were given fixed penalty notices for speeds in excess of 40mph.

PCSO Natalie Smith from the Community Policing Team has been out and about in the parish of Little Dunmow.

PCSO Smith spoke to local residents and businesses, introducing herself and offering crime prevention advice.

Patrols were also carried out in Felsted following reports of criminal damage in the park area of the recreation ground.

Officers from the Community Policing Team, Essex County Council Youth Workers and Uttlesford District Council have been supporting a County Wide operation to raise awareness of Child Exploitation.

Operation Henderson aims to raise awareness to business owners, taxi drivers and members of public about the signs of exploitation, especially around train stations where young people could be manipulated into criminality.

They visited Elsenham, Newport and Audley End to offer advice and guidance on how to spot and report concerns.

They conducted speed checks, foot patrol and offered crime prevention advice to the community.


It was great to speak to so many residents with a special mention to Amber for her kind note, seen below.
